- "University" means the University of Malakand established under (s) this Regulation; and
- "Vice-Chancellor" means the Vice Chancellor of the University.
- Establishment and incorporation of the University.— (1) There shall be established a University to be called the University of Malakand, with its principal seat at Chakdara, consisting of a Chancellor, the Vice-Chancellor, the Deans, the Principals and members of Syndicate, the Academic Council, the Board of Faculties, the members of University bodies, the teachers and students of the University, its constituent units and Colleges and such other officers and members of staff as may, from time to time, be determined, to be the officers and members of staff of the University.
- The University shall be a body corporate by the name of University of Malakand having perpetual succession and a common seal, with power, among others, to acquire, hold and dispose of any property or investments and shall by the said name sue and be sued.
- University open to all classes, creed, etc. The University shall be open to persons of either sex of whatever religion, race, creed, colour or domicile who are academically qualified for admission to the courses of study offered by the University and no such person shall be denied the privileges of the University on the ground only of sex, religion, creed, caste, race, class, colour or domicile.
- $Objectives\ powers\ and\ functions\ of\ the\ University. \end{picture} (1)\ {\it The\ objectives\ of\ the}$ University shall be the promotion and dissemination of knowledge in areas of emerging sciences and technology and to provide for instruction, training, research, demonstration and service in such branches of learning as the University may determine.
  - The University shall have the powers
    - to provide for instruction in such branches of learning as it may deem fit and to make provisions for research and for the advancement and dissemination of knowledge in such manner as it may determine;
    - (b) to admit and examine students;
    - to award and confer degrees, diplomas, certificates and other academic distinctions to, and on, persons who have been admitted to and have passed its examinations under the prescribed conditions:
    - to confer degrees on persons who have carried out independent research under prescribed conditions;
    - to confer in the manner prescribed honorary degrees or other distinctions on persons approved by the Syndicate for the purpose:
